### **Parents Evening Surveys**

Thank you to all the parents who completed the Parents Surveys at Year 7 and Year 11 Parents Evening. The results have been carefully looked at and I am really pleased to say that the feedback is hugely positive with 97% of Parents/Carers happy to recommend our school to other parents and Carers. It is also lovely that in Year 7 99% of parents/carers say their child is happy in school with well over 95% of Parents/carers in both Year 11 and Year 7 saying that their child does well in school and that the school has high expectations for them.

### **Behaviour System**

The Parent Surveys also indicated that 95% of Parents/Carers felt that the school acts to make sure its students are well behaved, this is a really pleasing figure as all staff do work hard to make sure that the students have high expectations of themselves so that they can learn really effectively in lessons. Ensuring that the culture for learning is right in school is one of the most important tasks in school as the Education that our students receive is the foundation for them to be successful in their careers in the future.

We are aware that there are a tiny number of students however that are currently on overall negative behaviour points and we want to ensure that these students make good choices in school and focus on their learning so they can do as well as they possibly can in their studies. In order to emphasise how important good behaviour is in school for those students who currently have negative behaviour points there will now be a 2-hour afterschool (rather than the normal hour) each time they are placed in an on-call detention. All parents/carers of students who are receiving this additional intervention have been written to separately this week. Of course, any student who moves back into positive behaviour points by consistently demonstrating high expectations will be moved out of this additional strategy.

### **Christmas Dinner Day**

Christmas Dinner Day in school will take place on Wednesday 13th December in students' normal dinner time, there will be a full Christmas Dinner available and a vegetarian option, the cost of the meal is £2.53 which includes a drink and a Christmas Cracker. Students need to buy a ticket for the meal in advance by the deadline of Friday 8th December, the tickets can be bought in the canteen on any day at break or lunchtime and any purchased tickets will then be given out by form tutors in the week beginning Monday 11th December. We will make sure the Christmas Music keeps our diners entertained! Only Christmas Dinner will be available on the 13<sup>th</sup> December.
