### **National issue of Vaping by Young People**

The Government has recently proposed the introduction of new legislation aimed at tackling the national problem of an increase in a small but significant young people using vapes across the country.

This is what the Government guidance says about young people and the dangers of vaping:

### What is the danger of children using vapes?

Children should never vape. The number of children using vapes has tripled in the last three years, and the bulk of that increase has been driven by disposables. The evidence is clear that vapes should not be used by, or targeted at, kids – due to the risk and unknown harms involved. That is why the Royal College of Paediatrics and Child Health has said disposable vapes should be banned.

The active ingredient in most vapes is nicotine, which when inhaled, is a highly addictive drug. The addictive nature of nicotine means that a user can become dependent on vapes, especially if they use them regularly.

We have a duty to protect children from these potential harms, which is why we will be banning disposable vapes and bringing forward measures in the Bill to restrict vape flavours, displays and packaging. Reusable and refillable vapes will continue to play a valuable role in helping adults to stop smoking.

We take our responsibility to protect students from harm and students are aware that if they are found with a vape in their possession or are seen vaping that they risk further serious action including suspension, we take this tough stance so that students know that vaping is unacceptable and so that other students don't feel pressurised into trying vaping because there isn't a clear message from school.

Although we have not had concerning incidents of students using vapes on the school site we have now taken the precautionary step of installing vape detectors in the main school bathrooms. The detectors when operational will send an email alert to relevant staff of the detection of vaping so that staff can respond appropriately. Students will be informed of this additional measure that we are putting in place in Assemblies next week, we are taking this approach so that we can support the health and wellbeing of students and the Government's zero tolerance approach to vaping in young people.
