Astroturf footwear and further information:

The school is pleased to announce that there has already been significant interest from the community in hiring the new school Astroturf and as a result this confirms that the facility will be a real asset to the wider community and the school.

The additional funding from pitch hire will provide money for the school to spend on the maintenance of the pitch, and the remainder will be added directly to the school budget so that we can further increase spending on the educational experience of all the students of St Thomas More RC College, both now and in the future. Every penny of the almost a million pounds investment was spent on construction of the pitch and associated facilities and the new Astroturf will now benefit thousands of students and countless members of the wider community who will use this first-class pitch over the coming years.

We are aware that some parents/carers have enquired about the regulations regarding permitted footwear for safe use of the Astroturf and we are more than happy to confirm the following:

- Students will be given advance notice of PE lessons by PE staff that will be timetabled on the Astroturf, this will mainly be football sessions in the first instance.
- Use of the Astroturf by school students will not begin until after the half term holidays
- As is always the case any items of PE footwear do not need to be a specific colour, for example there is no need for football boots to be black.
- During this academic year no detentions, sanctions or negative points will be issued for students who do not have football boots when they are timetabled to use the Astroturf, where possible instead they will be moved to an alternative PE group completing a different activity. On an occasion when it is not possible to move a student to an alternative PE activity, they will be able to observe the session from the viewing area on the pitch.
- Over the coming weeks the school will be looking to set up a football boot bank of preloved or donated football boots so that students have access to good quality footwear (for a small donation if possible) for use on the Astroturf.

I would just like to take this opportunity to reiterate my thanks to all the school staff and external partners who have worked exceptionally hard over the past four years to secure the additional funding needed for the project whilst also resolving project, planning, and construction issues to that have allowed this amazing resource to be created for the school.

Please can parents/carers do all you can to ensure that your child is completing all the questions on their Sparks Maths home learning, remember if they are stuck on any topic Sparx Maths will provide a video explanation of how to complete the question. By encouraging your child to complete Sparx maths you are actively supporting them to improve their outcomes.

For this reason it is really important that students DON'T use AI Calculators on their mobile phones to scan a question and provide the correct answer, if students do this then they won't learn how to answer the question correctly and Sparx Maths will be tricked into thinking they find the tasks easy so will start producing much harder work for them which might not be appropriate. If you can, please do check in that your son/daughter is completing Sparx Maths regularly and properly.
