In the past twelve months, Diocese of Salford schools and colleges have raised money to support thousands of local people in crisis.

Together, you've helped children and young people with empty tummies, families that can't pay their bills, and all of those who have nowhere safe and secure to call home.

The total you have raised is enough to provide:



1,585 energy saving measures to help reduce household bills.



77,672 showers so that the most vulnerable people in our communities can start their day clean, fresh and feeling confident just like we do.



353 weekly food shops. Feeding your family is tough enough when you have no money, but even worse if you're caught up in a crisis such as chronic illness, bereavement or fear of eviction.



37 sponsored rooms providing safe, supported accommodation for a year, preventing around 150 people from being homeless.



Fundraising in your school

Did you know. . .

by donating or fundraising in your school community, you'll be making a real, tangible difference to the lives of individuals and families in our area?



£8 donated could pay for toiletries for someone who has come to Caritas for support. This might include a toothbrush and paste, shower gel, deodorant, period products or shaving items.



£45 could pay for a three-course meal for 15 people at one of our day centres



£85 could provide a warm winter pack for those unable to leave their home or bed due to disability or illness



£157 could provide a family experiencing crisis such as chronic illness, bereavement or fear of eviction, with a weekly shop of food and other essentials

Your sponsorship of **£1,500** could help provide safe, supported accommodation for a year for someone, and prevent them being homeless.



Increasing demand for support in your area

According to latest statistics, in the area we work across Greater Manchester and Lancashire:



There are

8,928

children living in temporary accommodation. This is a staggering increase of **11 per cent** compared with the same time last year.



Numbers of people rough sleeping locally have risen too, with

481

individuals living on the streets with no safe, secure place to call home.

We're seeing a higher than ever demand for our services that help people in Greater Manchester and Lancashire who are experiencing poverty, homelessness and discrimination.

Supporting Christopher

Christopher (name has been changed) came to Caritas for help when he became homeless following an accident that meant his leg was amputated.

We supported him via our range of services and he is now moving on to his own accommodation, thanks to the kind donations of people like you. He has also offered to return to volunteer his time to help others who are homeless or at risk of becoming so.

He said: "It's scary to become homeless. Not all of us have a choice. so like in my scenario it just happened - the amputation and becoming homeless even after 25 years of working and bills, never claiming anything.

"In Caritas they consider your thoughts, your ideas and I think you've got more dignity here...Just the warm welcome and you're treated on the same level like everyone around.

"It was like a relief. When I came in here and I saw the Caritas sign, I said I'm in a safe place now, just the name and the reputation of Caritas. So that was something in the back of my head. It's a safe place."

"All my hard work paid off and I did well in my GCSEs - even better than I had expected, especially in maths. I don't think I would have been able to do this well if it wasn't for our sessions, so thank you so much for everything you did for me, I really appreciate it."

Campaigning for change

A huge part of our work is campaigning for change to the systems, processes and policies that lead to people experiencing poverty, homelessness and discrimination. Thank you to everyone in our diocesan schools who took part in our survey last year into child poverty in our communities as part of this ongoing work.



Your contributions have greatly strengthened our ongoing engagement with policy makers. We've been able to meet with multiple MPs and other key decision makers locally and nationally to raise issues and offer solutions and ideas about how the lives of children could be improved with urgency. Some of the MPs have also taken up the call to action and have directly raised questions with the Departments for Education, the DWP and others too.

We've also attended a special round table discussion on child poverty at the House of Lords, designed to help raise awareness and influence changes to the policies and processes that keep families trapped in poverty.

We have a range of free tools and resources for schools interested in supporting our campaigning work and are always happy to discuss ways you can get involved.
