This week we have had our very important Anti Bullying Assemblies in School. As a school we are against all forms of bullying and victimisation and we want all students to behave in a respectful, polite and positive manner with each other and all members of the community. We are aware that as students grow up that they can make mistakes, fall out and be unkind to each other, however the students got a very clear message this week that being deliberately unkind or engaging in repetitive hurtful banter at someone else's expense is not an acceptable way to behave and is not tolerated at St Thomas More RC College. Students are always reassured that when they do report any incidents to staff in school that they are dealt with appropriately and effectively so that students can feel safe and happy in their school. It is pleasing to note that in our most recent parent/carer survey from parents evening that over 92% of parents/carers felt that bullying was very rare in school or they had not heard about any incidents of bullying and that 92% of parents also felt that the school dealt with bullying effectively when students did fall out, or they had not had any experience of bullying in the school.

Students were clearly told in the assemblies this week about the wide range of avenues that they can use in school to report any concerns including using Whisper Online, speaking to the Safeguarding team or Designated Safeguarding Lead – Miss O'Mullane, reporting to staff in Room 41/Room 36, talking to their Form Tutor or Head of Year, telling a member of SLT, any teacher or indeed any other adult in school including support staff, as all staff in school are trained to pass on concerns to the most appropriate person to deal with any matters effectively.

Key Messages before the Mock Exams Year 11:

- The importance of the Mock Examinations can't be overstated, Students who do well in the Mocks go on to do well in the Summer GCSEs. Students must make the Mock Examinations a priority.
- Students have been given challenging/appropriate target grades to work towards for their Mock Exams, it is great to hear that some students have been requesting increased target grades!!
- Revision outside of school is key, students have been provided with a revision timetable and booklet, students should be doing some revision most days (5/6 days out of 7 days) in the lead up to the Mocks and Summer exams. Revision for the Mocks should have started now.
- Getting enough sleep this year is vital so that students can concentrate well in class everyday.
- Consider how much screen time (mobile phones/consoles) is appropriate to leave enough time for revision, if screen time is too high it needs to be reduced to leave enough time to revise for exams.
- Work hard in every lesson without distraction and ensure attendance and punctuality is as good as it possibly can be.
- Attend as many revision classes as possible afterschool, some of these classes have already begun in subjects such as RE and Geography and they can be vital in supporting students to hit and exceed their targets
