

Fr Miguel Pro SJ died, aged thirty-six, on 23 November 1927, one of twenty-five beatified rtyrs of Mexico's Cristero War

At 10:00 that morning, the sweater-clad Fr Pro was the first to be led out of the cells. No due process had been accorded him; he had not even received a trial. Nor was he told of his impending

he sensed something was about to happen...

Fr Pro walked across the compound with a steady, measured tread, holding his little crucifix in his right hand and his rosary photographers, reporters and distinguished guests stood around, waiting.

As his last request, Miguel asked to be allowed to pray. He knelt in front of the bullet-pocked walls and death, though it seems that in his left... little knots of fervently prayed for two

minutes. After his prayer he kissed his crucifix and stood with his arms outstretched in the form of a cross, rejecting the offered blindfold. Facing the firing squad, Miguel said, "May God have mercy

on you. May God bless you.

Lord, you know that I am innocent. With all my heart I forgive my enemies." As the gendarmes took aim, in a firm, clear voice, he spoke his last words: "¡Viva Cristo Rey!" - "Long live Christ the

The guns were fired: Fr Pro met his martyrdom calmly and heroically...

photographers, who had been invited by the fanatic Calles, kept the shutters clicking during the whole process, and for that reason, we have a good photographic record of the martyrdom. However, the stock photographic display of serenity and heroism soon made the possession of the photographs a crime.

Christ the King 2025 23rd November 2025

The Word This Week

The year of Saint Luke ends with a characteristic take on the feast of Christ the King: in Luke's gospel we are so familiar with seeing and hearing the voiceless, the rejected, those whom society puts in second place: how suitable, then, that on the feast of the King of all Creation we see him at his most vulnerable – on the cross, with only an abrupt inscription to announce that he is the King. He is King because of the work he has done, which is described by Saint Paul in the Second Reading: "all things [are] reconciled through him and for him ... when he made peace by his death on the cross." Next week, when we re-enter Advent and a new Liturgical Year, we will be thinking of the King who will come again: though he will come as his disciples saw him go at the Ascension, the marks of the cross will still be visible for all time, to remind us of the one who came to reunite all Creation, especially frail human creatures.
